Re: Sombath Somphone's Disappearance and 2016 ASEAN Summit in Laos

Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to you on behalf of a collection of American organizations and individuals concerned with the enforced disappearance of Sombath Somphone, a prominent Asian civil society leader.

We appreciate the actions your administration has already taken to call for the safe return of Sombath Somphone, a beneficiary of U.S. education, who was abducted outside a police post in the capital of Vientiane, Laos on December 15, 2012. We also applaud your personal commitment to and understanding of the critical need for worldwide civil society growth, as you have expressed at the United Nations and throughout your international visits.

In private bilateral discussions we urge you to raise two actions to help restore Lao civil society growth and confidence, which plummeted after Sombath's disappearance.

1. Urge the new Lao Administration to publicly announce a renewed investigation into Sombath's disappearance and to call for regional and international assistance on this unresolved case.

2. Urge Lao authorities to restore and increase safe public space for independent nonprofit associations and independent local media.

As you prepare your public remarks for the ASEAN Summit this September, we ask that you please raise once again the worldwide concern about increasing incidents of disappearances, violent acts and threats against civil society actors. We note increasing negative constraints on civil society sectors throughout ASEAN.

Your sustained concern could make all the difference, not only for Sombath, but in deterring future abductions of this kind and in promoting the vitality of ASEAN's civil society sectors.
